Amado Songcuan Untalan, born on June 3, 1941, in Samon, Sta Maria Pangasinan, passed away on April 26, 2024, at KP Vacaville Hospital. He was the beloved son of Bernardo Untalan and Adela Songcuan, both of whom preceded him in death. Amado was the second of six siblings: Pablo (deceased), Ernesto, Mercedes, Manuel, and Leonida.

Amado received his education at Samon Sta Maria Pangasinan and later attended Rosales National High School. He pursued higher education and graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from the University of the East. Following his graduation, he embarked on a career as an Accountant at Capitol Sawmill.

In 1969, Amado married the love of his life, Lisa Ocampo, and they were blessed with a daughter, Sheila Marie, born on December 16, 1970. Together, they migrated to New York City in April 1972 as third-preference immigrants. Amado is survived by his wife Lisa, daughter Sheila, son Jay, two sisters, two brothers and many nephews, nieces, and friends.

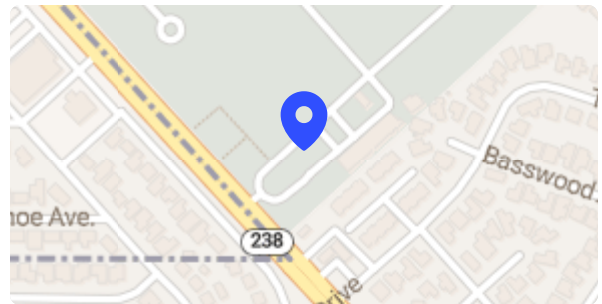

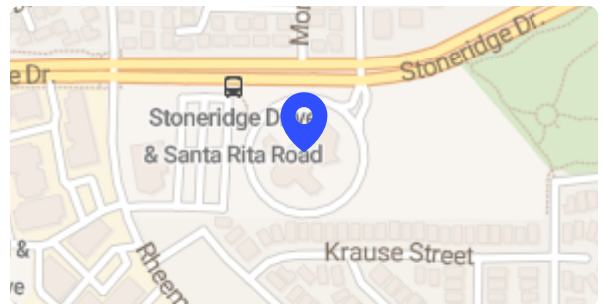
